- 5. Utilize the various structures and vocabulary found in beginner-level French language texts.
- 6. Acquire active vocabulary frequently used in contemporary French.
- 7. Read and/or repeat aloud with fluency and accuracy the contents of French language texts written for beginners in the language.
- 8. Obtain a strong foundation for further French language study.
