Catalog Description:

Introductory course focused on the study of functional French, with an emphasis on speaking, reading, writing, and understanding oral and written French in various situations and texts. Designed to enhance students' knowledge and appreciation of French Canadian language, culture, political issues, and business world. Five-week program begins with four orientation sessions followed by participation in a three-week French language immersion program in the province of Quebec.

Course Content Outline:

- 1. Speaking
 - a. Talk in detail about an event or experience;
 - b. Talk about a wish or goal
 - c. Talk about a book or movie and give one's opinion
 - d. Figure out how to deal with travel situations (asking for directions or making a purchase)
 - e. Take part in an impromptu conversation with another student about his/her daily life
- 2. Listening
 - a. Grasp the main ideas from a long discussion presented in a slow and clear manner
 - b. Understand the content of radio and TV broadcasts based upon familiar themes and presented in a relatively clear and slow manner
- 3. Reading
 - a. Understand relatively easy texts concerning student's interests
 - b. Find and understand basic information which students needs from newspaper articles and from the Internet.
 - c. Look for specific information needed in order to complete a task
 - d. Understand sufficiently well the events, feelings and wishes expressed in personal correspondence.
- 4. Writing
 - a. Write personal correspondence which describe in detail student's experiences, feelings and events in the past
 - b. Describe student's dreams, desires and ambitions
 - c. Tell the plot of a book or movie and describe what student thinks about it
- 5. Cultural Themes
 - a. Daily Life
 - b. Memories and personal events from the past
 - c. French Canadian songs
