- 5. Concert critiques of the group performances
- 6. Critiques of concert events by other ensembles

 - c. Jazz
 - d. Rock
- 3. Musicianship
 - a. Intonation and critical listening ensemble blend, and balance appropriate to the style of music
- 4. Performance interpretation including rhythmic performance, phrasing, dynamics, and articulation appropriate to the style of music
- 5. Importance of regularity and self-discipline in the development of music performance skills
- 6. Musicality and technical facility through the performance of selected ensemble literature
