Course Outcome(s):

Perform on stage based on personal character analysis and production concepts as recommended by the director.

Objective(s):

- 1. Distinguish one's self in the audition process.
- 2. Recognize the act of discovery for every theatre production
- 3. Incorporate the production concept as put forth by the director.
- 4. Explain the nature of ensemble work
- 5. Demonstrate the process of problem solving in building a role and character analysis.
- 6. Maintain commitment to the production.
- 7. Explain the audience's role in judging the quality and effectiveness of a theatrical performance.

Course Outcome(s):

Assist the technical director when striking set.

Objective(s):

- 1. Demonstrate proper storage of stage construction materials; flats, platforms, risers.
- 2. Demonstrate proper protocol for the removal and storage of stage lighting instruments.

Methods of Evaluation:

- 1. Supervision and observation by the director and academic theatre faculty.
- 2. Assessment of student work by artistic designers, the director and academic theatre faculty.
- 3. Critical journal written throughout the project detailing the process to production experience.
